Senior Service America, Inc. is recruiting for a Silviculture Mentor position in the pilot FS-ACES Program (55 years of age or older) at the Black Hills National Forest, in Custer, SD.

Role: Primarily responsibility is to provide mentoring and coaching to Foresters or Silviculture Trainees in the development, planning, and application of silvicultural methods and practices.

Responsibilities:

- Mentors Silviculturist trainees working towards their Silviculturist certification, (current or future NASP students) such as providing guidance with stand selection, prescription development, and preparation for presenting and defending trainee prescription work to an interdisciplinary panel.
- Reviews Silviculture prescriptions to ensure that plans, treatment, and harvesting techniques are compatible with long-range land management plans.
- Provides foresters support in developing marking guides for timber sales.
- Provides advice, technical support, and evaluation of proposed and ongoing timber sale programs.

Qualifications and Education Requirements: Must be able to pass a Federal Background check; Age 55+; BA/BS in Forestry, Natural Resources, or related field of study; 10 years of related experience; Must have been certified as a Forest Silviculturist within the past 10 years; Timber Information Manager Forestry (TIM) software; Physical requirements include the dexterity to reach, stand, climb, move, considerable walking, stooping, bending, lifting up to 100 pounds and the ability to work outside in environmental conditions. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential functions of this position.

Must possess:

- Knowledge of professional forestry land management principles, practices, and concepts sufficient to perform a full range of duties in the development and implementation of silvicultural land management treatments.
- o Knowledge of silvics, dendrology, reforestation methods, timber stand improvement principles and techniques, and harvest systems; familiarity with related fields such as wildlife, landscape architecture, plant genetics, hydrology, and soil science sufficient to develop silvicultural prescriptions which provide solutions to complex problems covering an array of environmental objectives.
- o Knowledge of the interrelationship of physical factors (including climate characteristics such as temperature, precipitation, and movement and composition of the air, and soil conditions such as texture, structure and depth, moisture capacity and drainage, and nutrient content) and biological planting and seeding programs, including the inventory of plantable areas.
- Knowledge of Agency policies and procedures sufficient to ensure that silvicultural plans and programs are consistent with such policies and procedures.
